



Elimu Africa: Education for Kids 2010 Annual Report

Mission: The mission of Elimu Africa is to help support disadvantaged students in Africa by facilitating their pursuit of education, which is vital to combating the cycle of poverty, disease and abuse.

Immediate Goals:

To support existing Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) or Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and schools in Tanzania which provide education to disadvantaged regions or disadvantaged students. Elimu Africa will award annual grants to organizations through an application process.

Elimu Africa will:

- Ensure accountability of our annual grant recipients and monitor the progress of their funded projects.
- Raise funds through local fundraising efforts and apply for corporate funds and grants.
- Help organizations attain donations of school equipment and materials.
- Facilitate volunteerism from abroad to Tanzania.
- **Support education of Tanzanian youth and adults on:**
 - The importance of obtaining an education for long-term success.
 - The value of showing equal respect for all people, including women and children
 - The importance of advocating for women's and children's rights.
 - The health issues facing Africans today.
 - Resourcefulness and business skills

Accomplishments and Highlights of 2010

- Provided \$8,000.00 to Holy Childhood Pre and Primary School, Moshi, Tanzania for textbooks, tables, chairs, shelves, computers, printers and a photocopier.
- Provided \$6,000.00 to Hope Academy, Usa River, Tanzania for food, uniforms, textbooks, computers, printers and items for the stationary shop. The stationary shop proceeds went toward supporting the school and to help Hope Academy become self-sustaining.
- Provided \$2200,00 in funds to the Second Chance Education Center, Moshi, Tanzania for door and window frames for the girl's dormitory. Once completed, the girl's dorm will provide a safe and effective learning environment for female students.
- Began work with Juliana Kato, a local Tanzanian teacher to act as Elimu Africa Representative in Tanzania. Juliana verified use of Elimu Africa Funds and helped secure accountability for use of Elimu Africa funds.
